Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the 33rd meeting between Auburn and Arkansas in women's basketball
- Auburn leads the all-time series 20-12, including an 8-7 advantage in games played in Fayetteville.
- Auburn has won the last two meetings, both under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy.
- Auburn won the only meeting last season, 56-48 in Fayetteville on Feb. 2.
- Auburn is 1-6 in true road games this season (won at FIU on Dec. 29)
- Auburn is 11-9 all-time in games played in the state of Arkansas
- The Tigers' win at FIU on Dec. 29 snapped a six-game road losing streak
- The Tigers have faced three top-10 teams in their first 5 SEC games (#1 South Carolina, #6 Tennessee, #10 Kentucky)
- The Tigers are 8-4 all-time on January 29 and 193-123 all-time in the month of January
- Auburn is 5-1 this season when forcing 25 or more turnovers but 2-4 when committing 20+ turnovers
- Auburn's defense converts turnovers into an average of 20.1 points per game
- The Tigers have recorded 15 or more steals five times this year, going 5-0 in those games
- Auburn is second in the SEC in steals (11.7), and third in assists (14.4/game) and blocks (4.9/game)
- The Tigers hold opponents to 55.3 points per game, fifth-best in the SEC
- Senior Hasina Muhammad scored a season-high 26 points at No. 1 South Carolina; 8-18 FG, 10-10 FT
- Muhammad leads the SEC in blocked shots (2.1/game) and is 11th in steals (1.9/game)
- Muhammad had her first double-double of the season vs. Georgia (18 pts, 10 rebs)
- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun all-tournament team
- Sophomore Katie Frerking has led Auburn in rebounding in 8 games
- Frerking scored a career-high 15 points at Alabama (1/22)
- Montgomery has three 20+ point games this season: 24 at Virginia (11/23), 20 at FIU (12/29), 21 vs. Miss. St. (1/26)
- Sophomore Khady Dieng was named to the St. John's All-Tournament Team after scoring 26 points in two games
- Tanner has three double-doubles this season (Troy, St. John's, Florida)
- Tanner leads the SEC in field goal percentage (.575) and is 14th in scoring (12.1 ppg)
- Tanner has two 20+ point games this season: 31 vs. Grambling (11/17) and 23 at Kentucky (1/8)
- Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and has 858 program wins

Auburn is in its 44th season of women's basketball and sports an all-time record of 858-419... Auburn has made 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, five WNIT appearances and three Final Fours in the program's history... Head Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 47-41 in her third season at Auburn... She has a 190-145 record as a head coach... Auburn advanced to the 2013 WNIT Quarterfinals and the 2014 WNIT Third Round... The Tigers are coming off back-to-back 19-15 seasons.

AGAINST THE SEC

- Auburn has an all-time record of 204-195 (.512) against the other 13 members of the Southeastern Conference (in league games).
- The Tigers have won five SEC regular-season titles (most recently 2009) and four SEC Tournament championships.

AUBURN-ARKANSAS SERIES

- This is the 33rd meeting between Auburn and Arkansas in women's basketball.
- The Tigers own a 20-12 edge in the all-time series that dates back to 1984. Auburn holds a narrow 8-7 edge in games played in Fayetteville. All but two meetings have taken place since Arkansas joined the SEC prior to the 1992 season.
- Auburn has won the last two meetings with Arkansas and eight of the last 11.

COACH FLO VS. ARKANSAS

- Auburn coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 2-0 all-time against Arkansas with both meetings coming since she became Auburn's head coach.

AGAINST THE NATURAL STATE

- Auburn has faced just two teams from the state of Arkansas in its 44-year history of women's basketball. The Tigers are 20-12 against Arkansas and 1-0 against Arkansas-Little Rock.

IN THE NATURAL STATE

- Auburn is 11-9 all-time in games played in the state of Arkansas. The majority of those contests have come against the Razorbacks in Fayetteville, but the Tigers are 5-2 in games played in North Little Rock (2003 & 2009 SEC Tournaments).

LAST MEETING: AUBURN 56, ARKANSAS 48 (2/2/14)

The Auburn women's basketball team went on a 10-2 run in the final 1:52 to record a come-from-behind 56-48 win over Arkansas in Fayetteville, Ark., at Bud Walton Arena.

Auburn (12-10, 3-6 SEC) forced 14 of Arkansas' 17 turnovers in the second stanza, and held them to just six field goals.

Three times in the second half, Auburn trailed by as many as eight points. Arkansas' Kiera Peak scored on a layup at the 4:07 mark, but the Razorbacks (15-7, 2-7 SEC) would only muster one additional field goal in the final minutes. With the game tied at 48-48, freshman guard Khady Dieng hit a three at the 1:19 mark, which gave Auburn the lead they would never relinquish.

In Auburn's final 18 points of the game, the Tanner sisters, both playing with four fouls, came up with 13. Tyrese scored seven, while Tra'cee recorded six. Bench play was key for Auburn with 23 points scored from reserve players, which outpaced the Razorback's bench, 23-5.

Auburn got out to a great start in the first half, jumping on Arkansas 16-10 through the first 10:40 of the game. But then the shooting went cold and only scored another four points in the last 9:20 of the first half and went in to the locker room down, 27-20.

Ty Tanner led the team in scoring with 13, and Dieng posted a career-high 10-points as the team's other player in double figures. Ty Tanner also posted eight rebounds.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

- Auburn is 9-11 overall, 0-7 in SEC play, coming off a 59-48 loss to Mississippi State at home on Monday. The Tigers have wrapped up a stretch where they played four ranked teams in a five-game stretch, but continue a streak of playing six top-25 teams in their first nine SEC games.

• Junior Tra’Cee Tanner continues to be the Tigers’ top scoring threat, averaging 12.1 points and shooting an SEC-best 57.5% in the first 20 games.

• Tanner has three double-doubles this season: 16 points, 10 rebounds vs. Troy (11/14), 12 points, 10 rebounds at St. John’s (12/20) and 12 points, 10 rebounds vs. Florida (1/4).

• She followed up her first double-double with a career-high 31 points on 14-of-18 shooting vs. Grambling State. She then scored 19 points in a win over FGCU, 23 in a loss at Kentucky, and has led Auburn in scoring in 10 of 20 games.

• Sophomore Brandy Montgomery recorded her third 20-point game of the season in Monday’s loss to Mississippi State. She scored 21 against the Bulldogs on 7-14 shooting (7-8 FTs), and she also had a 20-point effort at FIU (12/29) and a season-high 24 points at Virginia (11/23).

• Senior Hasina Muhammad has stepped up her game in SEC play, averaging 13.2 points/game in league contests to rank sixth in the conference. She scored a season-high 26 against No. 1 South Carolina.

• Muhammad had her second career double-double against Georgia on Jan. 11, scoring 18 points (16 in 2nd half) and adding 10 rebounds. She will be unavailable for Thursday’s game, serving the second of a two-game suspension.

• Pressure defense remains a staple of Coach Flo’s system. After averaging 20.0 forced turnovers per game during her first two seasons, the Tigers have forced an average of exactly 20.0 turnovers in the first 20 games of this season while racking up 11.6 steals/game.

• Auburn has held opponents to an average of 55.3 points per game this season, fifth-best in the SEC and 23rd-best in the country.

SCOUTING THE RAZORBACKS

• Arkansas is 11-8 overall, 1-6 in Southeastern Conference play. The Razorbacks have lost two straight, dropping a 55-53 game at Vanderbilt on Jan. 22 and falling at Florida 72-58 on Sunday.

• The Razorbacks, under first-year head coach Jimmy Dykes, were briefly ranked in the top 25 early in the season after a 7-0 start. Arkansas was picked to finish 11th and 12th in the SEC by the league’s media and coaches, respectively.

• Arkansas is the second-best rebounding team in the SEC, averaging 43.2 boards/game. Arkansas out-rebounds its opponents by an average of 8.8 per game.

• Kelsey Brooks is the SEC’s leading scorer, averaging 16.3 points/game for the season, and Jessica Jackson is 10th in the league at 13.5 points/game. Melissa Wolff pulls down 8.5 rebounds per night, fifth-best in the SEC.

• Arkansas has just nine players on its roster, but all nine average at least seven minutes per game.

• The Razorbacks went 19-11 overall, 6-10 in the SEC in

2013-14, and finished 11th in the league.

LAST TIME OUT FOR AUBURN

Auburn sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 21 points, but No. 18 Mississippi State pulled away early in the second half for a 59-48 win Monday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers led by as many as seven points late in the first half, but the Bulldogs took advantage of 23 Auburn turnovers and had 25 second-chance points after pulling down 17 offensive rebounds.

It was the third 20-point game for Montgomery this season as she led all scorers on the night. She shot 7-of-14 from the floor and 7-of-8 at the free-throw line, and she also had three steals on the night. Freshman Neydja Petithomme matched her career-high with 11 points.

Mississippi State turned a six-point halftime lead into a 10-point advantage less than two minutes into the second half. Auburn cut the lead back to six on a Montgomery jumper and a Petithomme layup with 16:56 to play, but the Tigers could get no closer. The Bulldogs would lead by as many as 20 before Auburn scored the game’s final nine points.

A 15-2 Auburn run over a five-minute stretch turned an 11-5 deficit into a 20-13 lead at the under-8 timeout. But the Bulldogs would put together a 15-2 run of their own, scoring twice in the final 30 seconds to take a 28-22 lead into halftime.

Auburn shot 40 percent (18-of-45) for the game and connected on 10-of-13 free throws. The Tigers also led in steals 12-10 - Katie Frerking had a game-high four swipes - and Auburn had six blocks to the Bulldogs’ four. Tra’Cee Tanner had three blocks on the night.

LAST TIME OUT FOR ARKANSAS

Defensive struggles early set the tone as the University of Arkansas women’s basketball team dropped a Southeastern Conference contest at Florida, 58-72, Sunday.

Sophomore Kelsey Brooks led the Arkansas scoring with 14 points and junior Melissa Wolff finished the game with 12 as Arkansas put together a balanced scoring effort. Jessica Jackson added 11 points, Jhasmin Bowen had nine and Calli Berna tallied eight points and seven assists for Arkansas.

Arkansas’ two leading scorers, Jackson and Brooks, were held scoreless for the first 11 minutes of the game. Arkansas shot 40.9 percent in the first half but hit just nine shots and struggled on the boards against the taller Gators. They were outrebounded 19-12 and suffered through 12 turnovers in the first 20 minutes, and Florida took a 41-24 lead into the locker room at the break.

Arkansas chipped away at the score cutting the lead to 10, then eight at the 6:50 mark and the Gators responded with a basket and plus-one stretching their lead back to 11.

But the Razorbacks wouldn’t go away. Arkansas put together a run hitting six-of-seven in a little over two minutes late in the game but the Gator offense continued to hit shots and hold on to the lead.

Arkansas finished the game shooting 36.4 percent on 20-for-55

- Senior Hasina Muhammad put together her best performance of the season and one of the best of her career, scoring 26 points (two shy of a career-best) at No. 1 South Carolina on Jan.

2. She was 8-of-18 from the field and a perfect 10-of-10 at the free-throw line. Muhammad also had three steals and three blocks in the game.

- Muhammad had her first double-double of the season and second of her career on Jan. 11 vs. Georgia with 18 points and 10 rebounds.

- With 13.2 points/game in SEC play, Muhammad is sixth in the conference in scoring in league games.

- Muhammad currently leads the SEC in blocks (2.1/game) and is 13th in steals (1.9/game).

TAKING OUR TALENTS TO SOUTH BEACH

- Sophomores Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the FIU Fun & Sun Classic all-tournament team in late December.

- Montgomery scored 20 points in 20 minutes and had a career-high 5 steals in a win over FIU, and Katie Frerking scored 12 points on 6-6 shooting against FIU and had a career-high 10 rebounds against Hampton.

KHADY IN THE BIG APPLE

- Sophomore Khady Dieng had two of her best performances of the season in the St. John's Chartwells Holiday Classic, scoring 27 points over two games against St. John's and SMU on Dec. 20-21.

- Her 14 points against SMU were a season-high, and she was named to the all-tournament team.

BIG NIGHTS FOR TRA'CEE

- Junior Tra'Cee Tanner had a career-high 31 points in a 92-42 win over Grambling State on Nov. 17. It was the first time an Auburn player scored 30 or more points since Blanche Alvenson had 32 against Mississippi State on March 3, 2013.

- Tanner's performance was the 35th time in Auburn history that a player scored 30 or more points in a single game.

- Tanner had another big night in the season's third SEC game, scoring 23 points at No. 10 Kentucky on Jan. 8.

BRANDY FROM DOWNTOWN

- Sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a career-high 24 points against Virginia on Nov. 23, including six 3-pointers. It marked the most 3-pointers in a game by an Auburn player since Ruth Ketcham had six vs. Colgate on Dec. 5, 2007.

- Montgomery needs just 14 more made 3-pointers to move into the all-time Auburn top 10.

CLUB PRESS

- Auburn's high-pressure, full-court defense under coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, referred to by the players as "Club Press," has ranked as one of the best ever at Auburn over the last two seasons. In 2012-13, Auburn's 402 steals set a new school record for a

single season while the 701 turnovers forced went down as second all-time on The Plains.

- In 2013-14, the Tigers forced 659 opponent turnovers while recording 354 steals, remaining a major force on defense in the Southeastern Conference.

- Auburn has forced 25 or more turnovers in a game 116 times since 1987 and has done so six times this season. Auburn forced 29 turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 25 in the win over Grambling and 27 in wins over Marquette, Samford and FIU.

- The Tigers have also tallied 15 or more steals in a game on 105 occasions since 1987, doing so five times last season and five times already in 2014-15.

- The Tigers used the defense to fuel their offense, averaging 19.3 points per game off turnovers last year. So far this year, Auburn scored 29 points off turnovers in the season-opener vs. Troy, 34 against Grambling, 28 vs. Marquette and 27 vs. Samford.

BACK-TO-BACK 19-WIN SEASONS

- Auburn has posted back-to-back seasons with a 19-15 record, which tie for the most wins in a season since the Tigers' SEC Championship season of 2009. The Tigers advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals in 2013 and the WNIT third round in 2014.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- The Tigers will play a challenging schedule this season, playing as many as seven non-conference games against teams that advanced to the postseason a year ago. Florida Gulf Coast, Winthrop, St. John's and Hampton all played in the NCAA Tournament last year, while SMU, Marquette and Bowling Green advanced to the WNIT.

- Auburn's first five SEC opponents - South Carolina, Florida, Kentucky, Georgia, and Tennessee - all advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. Texas A&M, LSU and Vanderbilt all made the Big Dance, while Mississippi State and Missouri joined Auburn in the WNIT.

- Six of Auburn's first nine SEC opponents will have been ranked in the top 20 at the time Auburn faced them: No. 1 South Carolina, No. 6 Tennessee, No. 10 Kentucky, No. 12 Texas A&M, No. 18 Mississippi State and No. 20 Georgia.

SISTER ACT

- For just the fourth time ever, Auburn's roster features a sister combination as twin freshmen Jazmine and Jessica Jones will be in uniform for the Tigers. It gives Auburn a pair of sisters on the roster for the third-straight year as Tyrese and Tra'Ce'e Tanner played together the last two seasons.

- Other sister combinations to play together at Auburn include Tyrese (2010-14) and Tra'Ce'e Tanner (2012-present); Sherell (2004-09) and Reneisha (2006-10) Hobbs, and Ruthie (1985-89) and Mae Ola (1984-88) Bolton.

NEW FACES

- Auburn welcomes five newcomers to the roster for 2014-15, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this year are G Bria Johnson (Baton Rouge, La.), F Jazmine Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), F Jessica Jones (Winston-Salem, N.C.), PG Neydja Petithomme (Boca Raton, Fla.) and F Asia Robeson (Kalamazoo, Mich.).

- The Jones twins, Petithomme and Robeson made their collegiate debuts vs. Troy on Nov. 14, and Johnson saw her first action in an Auburn uniform vs. Grambling State on Nov. 17.

ON THE TUBE

- A total of 22 Auburn games will be televised on either digital or linear networks during the course of the 2014-15 season. Eleven games will appear on SEC Network +, which is available online and on mobile devices via the WatchESPN platform. The Tigers' game at St. John's on Dec. 20 will also be available online via ESPN3.

- Ten games will appear on linear networks, with the SEC Network and Fox Sports Net broadcasting five games each.

TIGERS PICKED 10TH IN PRESEASON POLLS

- Auburn was picked to finish 10th in both the SEC Preseason Media and Coaches polls. South Carolina was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the SEC title in both polls.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

Auburn will welcome two top prospects to its women's basketball team in 2015 as head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy received a pair of National Letters of Intent in November.

Auburn will welcome forward Jonika Garvin (6-0, Lake Worth, Fla./Lake Worth Community HS) and point guard Janiah McKay (5-6, Gainesville, Fla./Gainesville HS) to The Plains in the fall of 2015.

"I think we really signed what we needed for our 2015 class," Williams-Flournoy said. "We're losing two seniors in Hasina Muhammad and Kiani Parker. Jonika is very athletic and can help us at the top of our press, and Janiah helps fill that point guard position in losing Kiani. Both of them could be very good defensive players. We definitely filled some needs."

AUBURN, Ala. - Junior Tra'Ce'e Tanner had her fourth career double-double, and the Auburn women's basketball team used a huge run around halftime to earn a season-opening 71-54 win over Troy on Friday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (1-0) kept up their trademark defensive pressure throughout the game, forcing 29 turnovers while amassing 22 steals on the night, falling just two swipes shy of a school record.

Tanner led the way both shooting and on the boards, scoring 16 points and pulling down 10 rebounds to earn her first double-double since posting 14 points and 10 boards at Tennessee last season.

Auburn controlled the boards on the night, out-rebounding Troy 51-41. The Tigers also had 21 assists to Troy's 10 and shot 43.5 percent while holding the Trojans to a 26.6-percent night.

Four Auburn players hit double-figures on the night. Along with Tanner's 16, sophomore Khady Dieng contributed 13 points while sophomore Katie Frerking and senior Hasina Muhammad had 10 apiece.

Frerking narrowly missed a double-double of her own, pulling down a career-high nine rebounds. She also had a career-best five steals along with two assists and a block.

Auburn led for more than 37 minutes on the night, but the big run came just before and just after halftime. The Tigers outscored the Trojans 16-0 over the final 2:24 of the first half and the first 1:32 of the second stanza, opening up an 18-point lead. Troy would get no closer than 14 points the rest of the way.

MIAMI - Auburn fought back from a nine-point halftime deficit but came up just short in a 44-42 loss to Hampton in the championship game of the FIU Sun & Fun Classic Tuesday afternoon at FIU Arena.

The Tigers (9-4) struggled to score in the first half but were able to create turnovers in the second half, keeping things close to the final horn. Auburn found itself down by 10 points in the latter stages of the game but fought back to a two-point margin. However, Auburn's inconsistency at the free-throw line - 9-for-17 in the game - proved to be a major difference in the two-point loss.

Brandy Montgomery and Katie Frerking were named to the all-tournament team. Montgomery scored eight points and pulled down six rebounds to go along with her 20-point, five-steal performance against FIU Monday. Frerking had a career-high 10 rebounds in Tuesday's game along with seven points; she scored 12 in the FIU win Monday.

Despite foul trouble that kept her on the bench most of the first half, Tra'Ce'e Tanner led Auburn with 13 points on 5-of-8 shooting. Junior Cabriana Capers came off the bench and put together one of her best games in an Auburn uniform, tying a career-high with eight points and pulling down seven rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

The Tigers turned up the defensive pressure in the second half, forcing Hampton (5-8) into four 10-second violations, and a 10-0 run to start the half gave Auburn a 22-21 lead. The Lady Pirates would move back ahead by as many as 10 points at 39-29 with just over eight minutes to play, but the Tigers kept chipping away. A Capers layup with just over three minutes to play made it a three-point game, and a Frerking free throw cut it to two. However, the Tigers could not take advantage of their last four possessions with a chance to tie or take the lead, missing their final six shots of the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Auburn's women's basketball team put a second-half center to No. 1 South Carolina, but the Gamecocks pulled away late for a 77-58 win in front of 16,465 fans at Colonial Life Arena.

Senior Hasina Muhammad led the Tigers (9-5, 0-1 SEC) with a season-high 26 points, shooting 8-of-18 from the field and draining all 10 of her free-throw attempts. Muhammad also had three blocks and three steals on the night. Neydya Petitthomme added 10 points, and Brandy Montgomery pulled down a team-best seven rebounds.

After trailing by 17 at halftime, Auburn came out of the break on fire. The Tigers shot better than 60 percent over the first eight minutes of the second half and went on a 16-4 run to cut the South Carolina lead to single digits at 48-40. From there, however, the Gamecocks went on a 19-4 run and found several ways to get to the free throw line, pushing the lead to more than 20 points.

The Tigers were only outscored by two points in the second half, mostly thanks to increased defensive intensity. Auburn forced South Carolina into 18 turnovers with 10 of those coming in the second half.

Carolina scored the first seven points of the game as Auburn struggled to find any open looks early. The much taller Gamecocks had five blocks on Auburn's first nine shot attempts and forced the Tigers into nine first-half turnovers. Auburn found some offense toward the end of the half, but South Carolina led 34-17 at the break.

Auburn shot 33.9 percent from the field for the game but showed dramatic improvement at the free-throw line, knocking down 12-of-14 attempts (85.7%). South Carolina shot 48.4 percent and had five players in double figures. Auburn had 11 steals to Carolina's eight, and both teams finished with six blocked shots.

A'ja Wilson (12 points, 10 rebounds) and Alaina Coates (11 points, 14 rebounds) had double-doubles to lead South Carolina. Aleigha Welch also had 12 points on 6-of-6 shooting.

The South Carolina crowd of 16,465 was the largest crowd to ever witness a regular-season Auburn women's basketball game. The only two larger crowds to see an Auburn game came at the 1990 Women's Final Four in Knoxville.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. - Auburn fought back from a big early deficit and had a two-point lead late, but Alabama came back and held on for a 51-50 win in a wild game Thursday night at Foster Auditorium.

The Tigers turned the ball over a season-high 29 times in the game, but had a chance to win in the final seconds. A pair of missed Alabama free throws led to an Auburn rebound, and the Tigers called timeout with 12.5 seconds left and trailing by one. However, the Tigers could not get a decent look, and Brandy Montgomery's shot at the buzzer was blocked to give Alabama the win.

Sophomore Katie Frerking scored a career-high 15 points and pulled down eight rebounds to lead the Auburn effort alongside Montgomery, who had 16 points. Tra'Ce'e Tanner added nine points and a game-high 10 rebounds.

Auburn fought back to take a 47-45 lead on a Frerking 3-pointer with 3:43 to play. But a Montgomery 3-pointer in the final minute would be the only points Auburn would score the rest of the way. Meanwhile, Alabama found its way to the free-throw line six times in the final three minutes, hitting three of their attempts. Alabama was 14-of-22 at the line while Auburn connected on 10-of-14 attempts.

Auburn controlled the major statistical categories in the game, save for turnovers. The Tigers shot 38 percent to Alabama's 30.2 and had 39 turnovers to Alabama's 33. But the Tigers' 29 turnovers (Alabama had 20) and the 31 points Alabama scored off those turnovers were too much to overcome.

At the 1:17 mark of the first half, a fight broke out that resulted in three players - Auburn's Hasina Muhammad and Alabama's Breanna Hayden and Meashont Knight - being ejected from the game.

Auburn then scored the final nine points of the half to cut the Alabama lead to 30-24 at the break. Seven of those points came in the final 18 seconds - a Montgomery layup-and-one with 18.9 to play, a steal and two free throws by Khady Dieng with 10.7 left, and a steal and score by Montgomery right at the buzzer.

AUBURN, Ala. - Auburn sophomore Brandy Montgomery scored a game-high 21 points, but No. 18 Mississippi State pulled away early in the second half for a 59-48 win Monday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers led by as many as seven points late in the first half, but the Bulldogs took advantage of 23 Auburn turnovers and had 25 second-chance points after pulling down 17 offensive rebounds.

It was the third 20-point game for Montgomery this season as she led all scorers on the night. She shot 7-of-14 from the floor and 7-of-8 at the free-throw line, and she also had three steals on the night. Freshman Neydja Pettithomme matched her career-high with 11 points.

Mississippi State turned a six-point halftime lead into a 10-point advantage less than two minutes into the second half. Auburn cut the lead back to six on a Montgomery jumper and a Pettithomme layup with 16:56 to play, but the Tigers could get no closer. The Bulldogs would lead by as many as 20 before Auburn scored the game's final nine points.

A 15-2 Auburn run over a five-minute stretch turned an 11-5 deficit into a 20-13 lead at the under-8 timeout. But the Bulldogs would put together a 15-2 run of their own, scoring twice in the final 30 seconds to take a 28-22 lead into halftime.

Auburn shot 40 percent (18-of-45) for the game and connected on 10-of-13 free throws. The Tigers also led in steals 12-10 - Katie Frerking had a game-high four swipes - and Auburn had six blocks to the Bulldogs' four. Tra'Ce'e Tanner had three blocks on the night.
